Easter Sunday

Dear Friends,

A very happy and blessed Easter to all of you! For the past few weeks, we have been walking the road of self-discipline, penance and sacrifice to prepare our hearts for this glorious day. From a worldly perspective, it seems rather strange that we would engage in such practices because they don't seem to benefit our selfish inclinations, but for the believer, they make sense because we see them as pathways to deeper union with Christ and a much more profound joy. For us, death means life and sorrow gives way to joy.

That is the way of contrasts. Sometimes we don't fully appreciate the blessings of life until we have experienced the storms. It is the contrast between the two that reveals the blessing. Take cloudy and rainy days, for example. Early in the week, the clouds were hanging over the city. Rain fell and winds blew. It was a quite dreary. On Tuesday, however, the sun came out and the weather was glorious! The brightness of the sun illuminated everything and its warmth was refreshing. It was the contrast between the two that made the sunny day far more welcome and appreciated.

This same principle plays out over and over again in virtually every aspect of our lives. We don't value health as much unless we have experienced sickness. We don't appreciate a vacation fully unless we have just come off of hard work. We don't know the glory of victory unless we have experienced real competition that tested our mettle. We don't appreciate freedom unless it has been hard fought. We don't glory in our favorite team's winning as much unless the it was a real nail-biter. It is the agony that makes the ecstasy much greater.

Contrasts bring to light many things and make everything much more meaningful. In Lent, hopefully we have given something up, added extra prayers, or engaged in acts of charity in order to be formed in the ways of Christian virtue. If we have been faithful, the joy of Easter will be far greater.

Precisely what we have been celebrating this past week is the contrast of the cross with that of the resurrection. We traveled through Holy Week and the Triduum, beginning with the somberness of the commemoration of the Lord's entry into Jerusalem. We listened to the Passion of our Lord. We celebrated the institution of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday. We entered into the mystery of Christ's death on Good Friday. Now everything gives way to the fabulous joy of Easter! What a glorious thing it is to celebrate life after dying to ourselves during the Lenten season. Death turns into life. Sorrow into joy.

The joy of the Resurrection must have been astounding for those first disciples! After believing Christ was gone, all of a sudden he proves himself to be alive! What incredible joy they must have had. If we walk in friendship with him, we realize that he is every bit as alive today as he was then. We too will find joy.

God knows what he is doing. At times, he allows us to endure hardships or suffering so that he can reveal the wondrous power of his love in an even greater way. This is significantly important. Sometimes we don't see the immensity of God's mercy until we go through the wringer. When we look at the world around us, sometimes it is the evil that rears its ugly head that makes us see more clearly and then shows us the the path to salvation. When we see violence, injustice, corruption, it makes the paths of justice, peace, and virtue more clear.

As we celebrate Easter, and the resurrection of our Lord, let us rejoice that he has died for our sins and for our salvation. Let us not be deterred by the hard challenges or the hurdles we have to face. His grace will get us through and the hope of the resurrection will help us to persevere. Jesus has risen! He has risen indeed! Alleluia!

New Directives Issued by Bishop Mulvey Regarding Mass Procedures

In light of Governor Abbott's executive order (GA34) lifting the COVID-19 operating limits for businesses and establishments, Bishop Mulvey has issued new guidance regarding safety practices for those attending Mass. In an effort to try to balance these new guidelines, while also ensuring the comfort and safety of those who may still be hesitant, we will implement the following practices:

1. The back pews in the two main center sections of the church will now be open.
2. The side section closest to the baptismal font and the statues of Mary and Joseph will continue to have every other pew roped off so that those who wish to maintain more distances can be seated there. The seating in the sections farthest back where the stained glass window of St. Pius X is and in the alcoves, will also remain as seating where 6 feet distance is maintained.
3. All church entrances/exits will be open and can be used. People are welcome to seat themselves.
4. Hand sanitizer and other sanitization procedures will remain in place.
5. Wearing of masks is still very strongly urged.
6. The holding of hands during the Lord's Prayer and hand shaking during the Sign of Peace is still omitted.
7. The method of distributing Holy Communion will remain the same.

REMINDER: Those who are symptomatic or who have been exposed to a person who is COVID positive within 7 days should remain at home. Those who are at risk due to underlying health conditions and those who are elderly are encouraged, for their own health, to avoid the risk of attending public celebrations of the Mass. The dispensation from the Sunday obligation to attend Mass is still in place for this group of people only. The Masses will still be live-streamed and if there is overflow, we will stream to the parish hall.

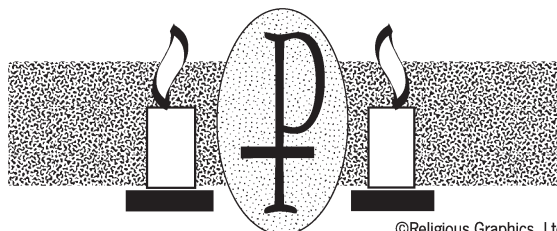
