



# Easter Sunday

Dear Friends,

He is Alive! He is Risen! He is Risen indeed!

Here we are again, celebrating another Easter! The church has been transformed from a somber environment marked by purple cloths and dry, lifeless branches, to an environment that is bursting forth with joyful white and gold colors and lively spring flowers intermingled with Easter lilies! The crucifix, which was previously featured in its starkness, is now draped with a white cloth, reminiscent of the white burial garments that were left behind in the empty tomb on the day of Christ's resurrection. All is new! Everything is full of life! Our attention is focused on a mystery that has been attested to by those first disciples who peered into a tomb and believed and by the women who encountered an angel proclaiming Jesus was alive.

Our faith is founded upon the mystery of the cross and the empty tomb. How can we be sure, though, that this mystery of Christ's death and resurrection is reliable? There doesn't seem to be much in the way of physical evidence to attest to the resurrection, and much of what we believe is based simply upon the testimony of his closest disciples. Essentially, we are being asked to have faith, but how can we do that when we rely so heavily upon provable evidence for so much of what we do believe?

Ultimately, our belief in the death and resurrection of the Lord is simply a matter of faith. Yet, if we take a look at circumstances and history, we can see so many signs of the reality of Jesus' death and resurrection. We can see instances when the power of life has overcome death. We can see signs of the resurrection in the Church which Christ established and we can see signs of the resurrection in its members.

Just think: why would those disciples of Jesus who were cowering behind locked doors, break out of those confines and boldly preach the Crucified Lord, risen from the dead? They must have had a clear first-hand encounter that transformed them. They met the risen Lord and were so convinced – so transformed by the experience, that they risked death to make the message known. In fact, many of them did die proclaiming the message of Jesus Christ risen from the dead. Most people are not willing to die for something unless they have confidence in its truth.

By the same token, many of the later Saints and martyrs also died offering their lives for a belief that many others were skeptical of, yet they did so because they too were convinced of the reality of Christ's cross and resurrection. The interesting thing was, the more that people attempted to squelch belief in Jesus Christ crucified and risen, the more faith in this reality grew. The blood that the martyrs shed by their death, gave rise to more believers. Witnesses of the martyrdom of the saints found themselves believing the message. Life came from their death. The power of the resurrection gave birth to new believers.

Throughout the ages, there were times when there were forces that threatened to exterminate the Church, yet the Church still thrived. In times of persecution and oppression, the power of the resurrection of Jesus still bore fruit through faith in the hearts of believers. Even in our own day and time, Christianity is facing great obstacles and persecution is manifesting itself in many realms. Despite that, people are becoming more convicted of their belief and faith is taking deeper root. There is a solidifying of belief despite the secularization of society. This is another manifestation of the power of the resurrection and its ability to overcome death.

Signs of the reality of the resurrection are also present in the hearts of everyday believers. I personally have always had faith in the resurrection of the Lord, but the reality became convincingly impressed upon my soul when I was merely a teenager. I had a powerful experience of the reality of the living Jesus when I was on a youth retreat. I had a moment when the Lord touched my heart in such a way that I became unquestioningly convinced that Jesus was real and alive. That belief penetrated my soul. It was an experience that was more real than any other experience I have ever had. I have seen evidence and proof of many things, but nothing so real as the experience of the Living Lord. May the Risen Jesus touch your hearts and fill you with joy today! Believe in life that came forth from the empty tomb!

He is Risen! The students and staff of St. Pius X Catholic School wish you a very Blessed and Happy Easter.

We just returned from Spring Break last Monday and 3 ½ days later, we started our Easter holidays at noon on Holy Thursday. We will return to school on Monday, March 28th. Although it was a short week, we managed to accomplish a few things. We had a Golf Tournament meeting, Last Supper celebration, a Seder Meal, and a basketball game.

All of our classes took part in Last Supper celebrations this past week; however, our 6th graders participated in a traditional Seder meal (celebration of the Jewish Passover) that was prepared and served by our parents. It took place in the Parish Hall and featured food such as lamb (represents how the Jewish people were saved by the blood of the lamb), charoset (represents the mortar the Jewish people used in slavery to build things), celery/parsley (bitter herbs to remind the Jewish people of the bitterness of slavery), and matzo crackers (to escape from the Egyptians, the Jews had no time to leaven bread. So they ate unleavened bread or matzo). It was a beautiful ceremony made extra special by the help of Mrs. Ruth Baltz, one of our faithful school volunteers. She not only knows about Seder meals, but all of the other traditions and ceremonies that our Jewish brothers and sisters celebrate throughout the year. Thank you Ms. Ruth!

Our Golf Tournament will be held this Friday, April 1st at the Corpus Christi Country Club, with a shotgun start at 1:00 p.m. Teams are forming and sponsors are lending us a hand with their support.
