Dear Friends, Nearly all of us know what it is like to feel out of place. Either we have been amongst a group of people who were not very welcoming, or we were ostracized by other school kids, or we were at a dinner with people with whom we had little in common. Generally, the experience of alienation, whether perceived or actual, is not a very pleasant one. As Christians, we are called to take care that we extend God’s universal compassion and concern to those who are alienated or outcast.

I remember one time during my seminary years, that a fellow classmate and I decided to stop for lunch to eat some Pho (Vietnamese noodle soup) in a part of Houston noted for its Asian restaurants and demographics. We were well accustomed to eating ethnic foods because there were various cultures represented in the seminary community. Some seminarians were from Africa, some from Asia, some from Eastern Europe and others Latin America. All the others were from the United States. With so much diversity, it was easy to develop an appreciation of other cultures and an international taste for food.

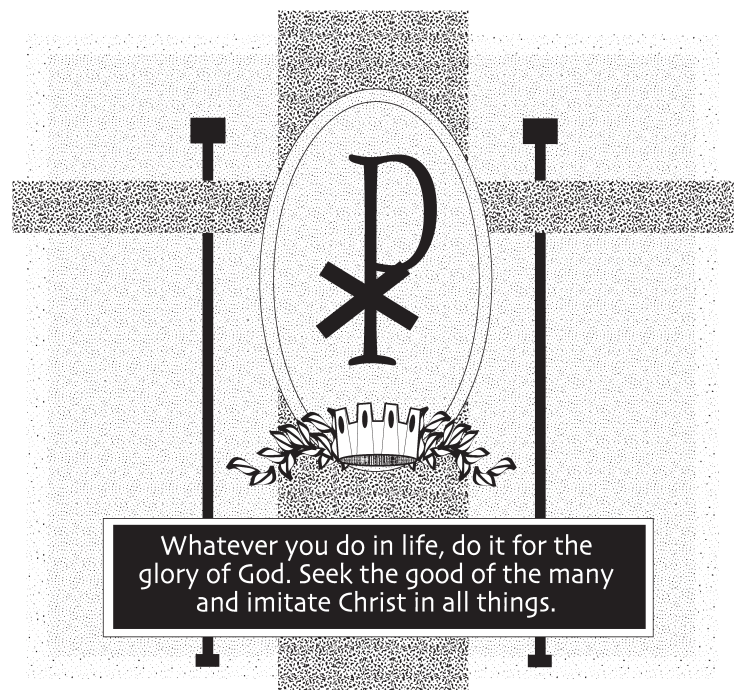
On this particular occasion, my classmate, who is Hispanic, and I stepped into one particular eating establishment. Immediately, we both felt the eyes of practically everyone in the restaurant staring at us and I felt very much out of place. By their reaction it was obvious that we were not the normal clientele for that particular cafe. They probably just thought that we were lost! Interestingly, one of the wait staff began talking to my fellow classmate in Vietnamese! My classmate didn’t seem the least bit surprised because, as he later explained, he is often mistaken for a Vietnamese person. Indeed, I could see how his facial features might lead one to believe that.

My classmate and I had a good chuckle about the situation. Despite that, we sat down, ate our Pho and went about our business.

Most of our experiences of feeling outcast or out of place cannot compare to the type of alienation that a leper experienced during the time of Jesus. Life for them was miserable. Lepers were quarantined and made to dwell apart in leper colonies or in caves outside the city. The fear was that they might be contagious and infect others. Their treatment by others was inhumane and people avoided them at all cost. Lepers had to shout out a warning of their “unclean” condition to passersby. Jesus breaks through this inhumanity though, by reaching out to touch the leper in the Gospel in order to heal him. He shows that God’s healing grace is available to all who ask.

In our own day and time, there are people who are shunned because of their appearance, or their social status, or innumerable other reasons. Sometimes, we don’t consciously alienate people, but we tend to stay within our comfortable circle of friends and may not realize that we are being exclusive. At other times, we simply neglect to be attentive to the people around us.

As a parish community, we have the ability to have a tremendous impact on people’s lives. By actively welcoming others into our
