

Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

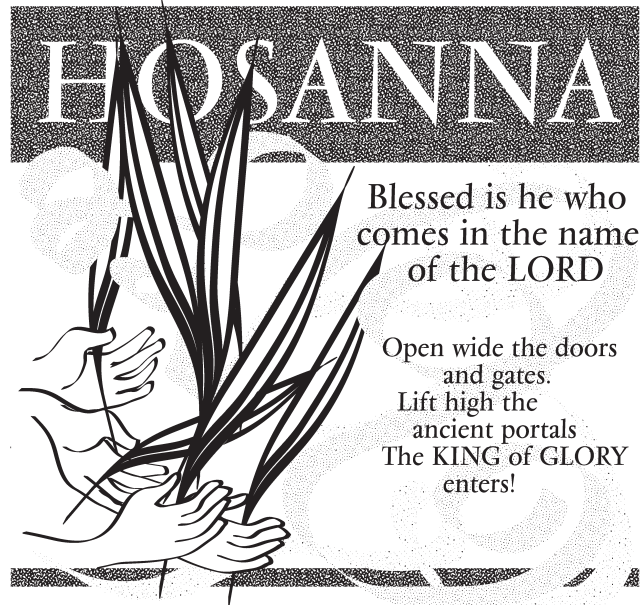
Dear Friends: What a magnificent day this past Monday was! People from around the Diocese of Corpus Christi gathered at the American Bank Center for a conference and Mass, inaugurating a year-long series of events commemorating the 100th anniversary of our diocese. Nearly 40 Cardinals, archbishops, and bishops joined in the festivities. It was a joyful moment that reflected both the universality of the Church, and the tremendous faith that has blossomed through the efforts of so many individuals throughout South Texas history. Their resilience and tenacity has built up a church that is vibrant and growing.

Throughout the day, Fr. Joseph and I had the opportunity to spend some time with some of the most influential figures in today's Church, namely the visiting cardinals and bishops. I was personally impressed with how engaging, enthusiastic, and faithful these leaders are. Listening to them speak, and conversing with a few of them left me greatly edified and genuinely heartened by their love for Jesus. It is obvious that we are living in a wonderful time in the Church. Despite the threat that secularism poses in the world today, it seems to me that we are going to see a resurgence of faith and an increase in prophetic witnesses that will draw more and more people to Christ. As I have said in various ways recently, it is when the Church faces challenges that she is at her best.

A major theme that emerged in the conference and Mass Monday is what Blessed John Paul II called the New Evangelization. Evangelization is at the heart of the Church. The Church is called to preach the Gospel in a vigorous way in a world that secularized. It is important for us to stir up a healthy zeal to live out the Gospel and not to be afraid to elucidate for people its truth. This must always be done in humility and repentance.

It is with this in mind that we now enter into the somber and sobering time of Holy Week. Today's celebration of Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion recounts the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem and the dramatic events leading to Jesus' death. On the surface, the tone of today's commemoration seems incongruous with the joyful tone of the New Evangelization that we experienced at our centennial gathering. In reality, though, they are integrally tied together. Passion Sunday reminds us that Jesus took upon himself our sins and the sins of the whole world. It was because of our sins that Jesus suffered and died. Recalling these events as we do, we can't help but become more acutely aware of our own faults and sins. This is healthy for us as Christians. If we are to effectively evangelize, we must first look within and ask forgiveness for the wrongs that we have done. Then we can more effectively preach the Gospel. A parent cannot convincingly ask a child not to do something if the same parent has not first corrected that behavior within him or herself. Otherwise, the advice would fall on deaf ears.

So the recounting of the Lord's passion and death today, should lead us to ponder and evaluate how we have sinned, and how we need to make a change in our lives. At the same time, it should bring to mind the tremendous mercy and love of Christ, who was willing to die for us and for the salvation of all humanity. His self-offering was the ultimate act of humility and service. The Scriptures tell us,
