

Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Friends,

Earth. There is something elemental; something very basic about it. Having our feet firmly planted on the ground and having handfuls of earth sift through our fingers is a good thing. That connection we have to the earth connects us to reality.

Throughout my priesthood, I have often felt compelled to go outside and dig in the earth and get my hands dirty with a little manual labor. Even though I have little time for it now, I thoroughly enjoy mowing the lawn, trimming trees, turning the dirt in a flower bed, and even pulling weeds! By doing so, I engage a totally different part of my self, which somehow makes me feel whole again.

Perhaps that is one reason I have often enjoyed hiking and backpacking so much throughout the years. I credit this love to my Boy Scout experiences as a young lad, but I also just love to be in nature and to breathe in fresh air. Some of the reason I enjoy digging in the dirt may also be attributed to the fact that it is bred in my bones. I come from a heritage of farmers who worked the land.

Living in the somewhat sterile environment of our homes, we don't seem to have as much connection with the earth anymore. Whenever the storms come, or the winds blow, we remain safely sheltered and protected from the elements. We don't feel the impact of heat and cold as much, and unless we take walks, work in the yard, or our work takes us outside, our senses are not engaged as much by nature. This can ultimately lead to a false sense of security and pride. Whenever a roof leaks, I am reminded of that false sense of security, and that there are some things that we have no control over. It is a humbling thought to know that, despite our best efforts, nature can always find a way to thwart our attempts to tame it.

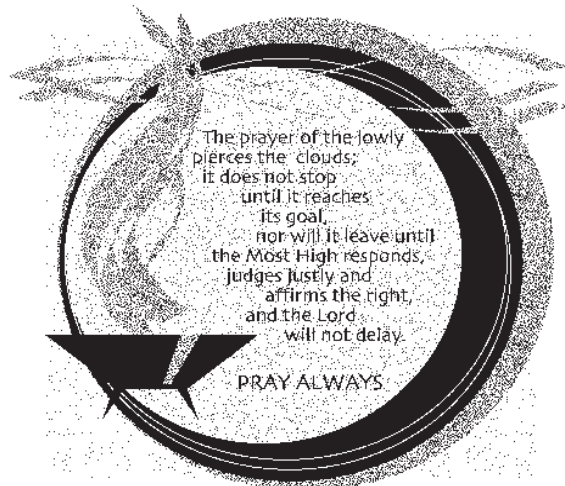
One can't help but wonder if our disconnection with earth doesn't sometimes disconnect us from reality? If we are always consumed by technology and never engaged in that interaction with the outside world, it might become very easy to develop a sense of grandiosity that prevents us from being in touch with reality. There is something very humbling about having to go out and shovel dirt. Doing so, I usually discover how limited I am, because the ground in Corpus Christi can easily bring me back down to a sense of powerlessness when I realize how hard it is to penetrate!

In the Gospel today, we have two contrasts. On one hand, we have the Pharisee who seems rather full of himself and out of touch with reality. In his pride, he stands erect and perceives himself from a lofty and unrealistic perspective. On the other hand, we see the publican, the tax collector. He is broken down by life. He kneels closer to the earth in humility and perceives the reality that his life is a sinful life. His humility keeps him closer to the earth and closer to true reality. He recognizes that he is nothing and that God is everything.

When we start to live in a way that is not grounded in reality, we lose sight of our true selves, and we lose sight of God. When we get "knocked back down to earth" by our sinfulness, we actually become more attuned to God because we realize our dependence upon him. Humility, then, empties us of pride, so that God can pour himself into our lives again. Whereas, pride pushes God farther away, because our ego crowds him out.

In the spiritual life, it is always better to be rooted in the earth or "grounded", so to speak. The closer we are to the earth, spiritually speaking, the more whole we feel, and the more connection we have with The Divine.
