Dear Friends,

One of the oldest depictions of Jesus is that of the Good Shepherd. In ancient frescoes and even some statuary, Jesus is presented as carrying a sheep hoisted on his shoulders. These have been found in Christian tombs and other locales in Rome, Israel, and other places. But the image of God as a shepherd is a classic one that predates even the Christians. There is something about the image of a shepherd that seems to fit the Divine perfectly.

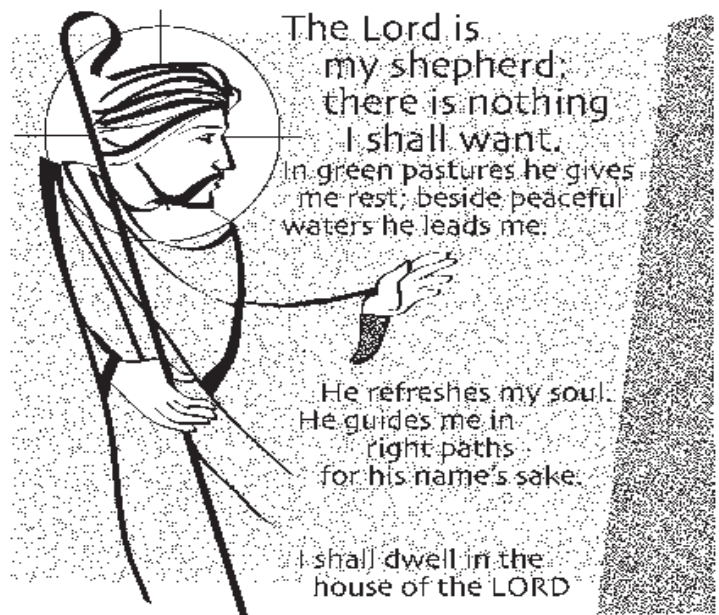
Perhaps the most striking reference to God as a shepherd is found in the most famous of the psalms, Psalm 23. It is typically associated with the funerals of loved ones or with one of life's difficult situations. This particular psalm carries with it powerful words of comfort and hope. The minute we hear the first verse – "The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I lack" – we can immediately identify it. It continues, "In green pastures he makes me lie down; to still waters he leads me; he restores my soul. He guides me along right paths for the sake of his name. Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff comfort me." These words lyrically convey the caring love of God. They describe the true nature of a shepherd.

A shepherd is someone who foregoes self-interest to safeguard the flock. However, it doesn't stop there. A shepherd's job is not just to protect the flock from harm, but also to lead the flock where it can be adequately fed and well-provided for so that the sheep will be healthy and strong and free to graze in abundance. A shepherd's job is to guide the sheep, giving them direction and keeping them together with a little prodding if necessary. Sometimes this little forceful persuasion is needed to keep the sheep from veering too far off. The constraints that the shepherd establishes serve to provide a sense of security and comfort for the flock.

All of these things are what we look for in a spiritual shepherd as well. We don't want a shepherd who will allow us to go off in all directions without any constraints. Without proper guidance, we might make moral decisions that would result in chaos, making us susceptible to many dangers. A good spiritual shepherd helps us to know the difference between right and wrong and warns us against things that can endanger our souls. The purpose is not to stifle or curtail us, but to keep our souls in prime condition to receive the abundant blessings of God. The shepherd always knows where the pitfalls of life are and also where are the best circumstances in which to partake of the fullness of God's grace. A good shepherd will make sacrifices for us so that we receive extra care to help us grow in holiness. The same shepherd leads us to pastures of virtue that build us up and keep us spiritually healthy.

Jesus is all of this. He comforts, teaches, guides, snags us from peril, and rescues us from sin. There are many earthly shepherds that do the same. Men and women who mentor us, parents who raise us, and friends who accompany us, can all be good shepherds.

Today, we honor in a special way, those women in our lives who have given us guidance and who have sacrificed themselves for our sake in innumerable ways, so that we might grow both physically, emotionally, and spiritually. We honor our mothers who shepherd us through their guidance, love and care, which provide us with an awareness of God's love for us. Without them, and without their acting in our best interest, we might not have learned the virtues we possess. More than anyone, perhaps, they have had the single greatest influence in our lives. They bring the presence of Christ, the Good Shepherd,
